Sahiya-Majid Education Scholarship

The 'Sahiya-Majid Education Scholarship' is named after the late Abdul Majid Sardar and the late Sahiya Begum, parents of the Chairman of SIMEC Group, eminent social worker and established businessman, Eng. Sardar Md Shaheen. It is a completely non-profit, non-political educational project. The main objective of this project is to contribute to the overall development of the education sector in Bangladesh.

Abdul Majid Sardar was a devoted social worker. He dedicated himself to various social service activities in his personal and professional life. Both of his parents were committed social workers.

Their dream was to facilitate the education of poor and talented students in the country. With the aim of realizing their dream, their youngest son Eng. Sardar Md Shaheen has been personally managing this program since 1998. SIMEC Foundation started its journey in the beginning of the year 2000. In that same year, SIMEC Incorporation was established. SIMEC Group was not yet established. SIMEC Incorporation has only started to take small steps as a software house. Since the inception of the SIMEC Foundation, SIMEC Incorporation has provided overall financial support to institutionally manage the timely and important philanthropic activities of the Foundation. Later, SIMEC Foundation was established as an organization of SIMEC Group. Since then, "Sahiya-Majid Education Scholarship" became known as a project of SIMEC Foundation. This program has been striving to provide quality education to Bangladesh's rural communities. One of the primary objectives of this project is to create a modern Bangladesh with educated citizens by enlightening the underprivileged rural areas.







Abul Kalam Mandal Computer Training Center We are all familiar with the phrase 'Digital Bangladesh,' which is quite an important phrase. This phrase is known to all in Bangladesh. In the early days, people laughed at this phrase, but not anymore. Now, 'Digital Bangladesh' is a source of great pride for us. In the beginning, people did not understand the magnitude of the word. It is now easy to estimate the impact this program will have in building a developed Bangladesh. People from cities to villages are now enjoying its benefits.

However, the full realization of this program requires a skilled workforce proficient in the use of computers. Computer education should now be compulsory for all, but it is not possible for all the people of Bangladesh to bear the cost of this expensive education.

SIMEC Foundation has endeavored to educate the rural population in computer education. With the aim of providing computer training to the poor but interested people, "Abul Kalam Mandal Computer Training Center," named after the late Abul Kalam Mandal, was established where students can receive free short and long-term training and employment opportunities. The program is conducted under the overall supervision of a highly educated volunteer with a Master's in Computer Engineering. It is our sincere hope that we can play a role in building a Smart Bangladesh.



Afsana Khanom Sewing Training Center

SIMEC Foundation's mission is to bring smiles to the faces of people in rural areas. Helping someone be self-reliant is nobler than giving them money. If one person in the family is self-sufficient, the whole family is self-sufficient; a country becomes self-reliant when all its regions are self-reliant. Hands-on training is the key to the socio-economic development of women. With that motivation, this training program has been created by the SIMEC Foundation.

SIMEC Foundation has been working steadily since 1998 to ensure the welfare of the country and society. The foundation believes that a country cannot be self-sufficient by leaving women behind. SIMEC Foundation will continue to work tirelessly for the development of women. The 'Afsana Khanom Sewing Training Center' will play an important role in bringing social change by creating employment for women. Skilled women will be able to reduce the poverty of their families to some extent.

Not only the poor, widows, landless, destitute, or freedom fighter family members are covered under this program; hand sewing training is being provided free of charge to women from all walks of life. We believe that all students will be able to arrange self-employment in this four-month training. As trained students can establish themselves in society through their skills and efforts, this program can be considered a necessary initiative in the context of our country. The efforts and success of the trainers and trainees will act as the main driving forces for the progress of "Afsana Khanom Sewing Training Center".









Shonim Shaheen Community Clinic

Shin-Shin Japan Hospital is one of the most notable organizations of the SIMEC Group. Expert doctors and engineers from Japan and Bangladesh have put great effort into establishing this hospital that maintains modern standards and has the latest technology. Japan-Bangladesh joint venture "Shin-Shin Japan Hospital" has been designed as a model hospital with the aim of providing world-class medical services in Bangladesh using Japanese technology and services.

The hospital is run under the supervision of experienced and expert doctors. Apart from general patients, special ultrasonography of expectant mothers, maternal and child health services, adolescence-related health issues of girls, and various treatments for pre-marital and post-marital issues are provided here for underprivileged patients in rural areas free of charge. SIMEC Foundation always strives to provide free essential weekly treatment and counseling under 'Shonim Shaheen Community Clinic'.

Blood Donation Program

May one's blood save another's life, and may blood tie souls. SIMEC Foundation, an organization committed to human service, has taken the initiative to save the lives of severely sick patients through a voluntary blood donation program. A bag of blood from a voluntary blood donor can save the life of a dying patient, and the donor faces no risk. The employees of the foundation are working to encourage healthy people aged 18 to 60 years to donate blood and create awareness. Studies have proven that regular blood donation reduces the risk of heart disease, heart attack, cancer, and other complex diseases. It can increase immunity as well. Therefore, the community clinic project workers are determined to stand by the destitute people by creating awareness among people across the country and creating a list of voluntary blood donors.





Maulana Ibrahim Center for Religious Learning for the Elderly

Every Muslim must receive religious teachings to acquire an unconditional faith in Islam. It is the duty of every Muslim to receive religious education and put faith in some of the spiritual aspects of Islam. Thus, realizing its importance, the SIMEC Foundation established the "Maulana Ibrahim" Center for Religious Learning for the Elders" to spread religious education in society. Many elderly people in rural areas could not receive religious education due to the lack of time or busyness. One of the objectives of the "Maulana Ibrahim Center for Religious Learning for the Elders" is to provide them with religious or Islamic education. The elderly people are taught Surahs, Qur'anic lessons, Hadith lessons, etc., by trained Maulanas. Through the Maulana Ibrahim Religious Education Center, the elderly in rural areas can play a significant role in social development by receiving llam education or religious education. The elderly will be free of boredom, worries, and loneliness by spending time in this educational center. This religious education center will be able to prevent people from being associated with various negative aspects of society, such as gossiping. Overall, Maulana Ibrahim Center for Religious Learning for the Elders will play a leading role in building an enlightened society by teaching the morals of Islam to the elderly. Like all the other initiatives of SIMEC Foundation, this religious education center for the elderly will be completely free and run for the development of society.

Recently, necessary plans have been adopted to work on midwifery training and caregiving in this clinic, which will have a far-reaching role for women's wellbeing. The SIMEC Foundation launched a project named "SIMEC Polli for Women Empowerment" to understand the current skills and needs of women and involve them in sustainable economic activities. Under this project, SIMEC foundation will form a self-help group (SHG) to provide training to women in tourism-related activities so that they can become financially and culturally empowered.
